1] On the Field Lots of highlights during June, but the retention of the Mactavish Cup against a spirited Glenurquhart side was very satisfying. It was a pity the grass was so long and we have made representations to the Association as it affected the quality of play that was possible.

We have also had three close matches against Lovat coming out on top in the two cup competitions. Meanwhile in the league Kyles have slipped up and it looks like Kingussie may be the team to beat, with Oban coming into form.

The 2nds lost their grip on the Sutherland Cup to a very good Lochside Rovers team, but saw off Lovat in an entertaining match to advance in the Strathdearn. They also remain in contention in the league.

The under 17s were disappointed to lose out in the Mactavish junior cup against Kingussie, but got a measure of revenge as a 3-2 win against them in the London Shield which means a play off at the end of the summer holidays.

The star performers so far this year are our Primary School teams with the latest success being for the P4/5 and 6/7 at the Kinraig 6s. They are in the finals of the three competitions...the Tulloch Cup and the CA cup finals will be after the holidays, but the Mackay Cup Final against Inverlochry is on **Friday 5th June at 1700 at the Eilan**

- this Saturday 6th July the 1sts play Skye in the Camanachd quarter final at 1500 after the 2nds play Kinlochshiel in the league at noon.
